July 23, 1947, - Wednesday - On return from Alumni Meeting at St. Benedict; found letter from Apostolic Delegate on my desk regarding forthcoming appointment as bishop. After calling Archbishop that night, sent telegram of acceptance - placing myself in God's Hands! - to N.O. next day to see Altp. (lunch with him)

Aug. 5, 1947 - Tuesday - Notified by telegram from Apostolic Delegate of public announcement on Aug. 7, 1947.

Aug. 7, 1947 - Wednesday - "Morning Advocate" carried appointment news. Went to Ribodun, after calling to give news, as also to Thelaise, & Lucien. (who was at a function at St. Vincent de Paul & not available) - Many messages, etc.

Aug. 8, 1947 - Friday - To N.O. to see Archbishop. - Met after he had consultants & deans in for dinner, with me as guest of honor. - Later in month went to Signal Mountain with Dr. Schermyder for 10 days. - Numerous messages etc.

Sept. 29, 1947 - Investment of Monsignor at Cathedral, Lucien as O.A. - pontificating as Mass. - Archbishop gave me parchment of monsignor appointment.

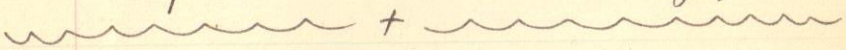

St. Paul tells us: "Whatever you do, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus." - Cultivate living in the presence of God, going from one duty, one occupation, to another in His Name and for love of Him. Offer all to God: the pleasant & the unpleasant, the easy & the difficult etc. etc.

Wednesday Sept. 29th - At morning meditation: "Always to go forward, never to turn back": motto of Fra. Junipero Serra. - And Jesus to Peter: "Put out into the deep." - i.e. the goal of putting out towards sanctity.

9:30 a.m. - (changed from 9:00 a.m.) - On Discipleship - of Jesus. Words: "Follow me" and Discipleship call for each other. The call of Levi is described in one single verse: St. Mark 2: 14 - "As He moved on he saw Levi the son of Alphaeus at his tax collector's post, and said to him: 'Follow me,' Levi got up and became His follower." - Brief, pointed command; brief no-word answer, prompt & final. - No reference to Levi's past; no "job description" for his future. - Got me: no questions about what to do, ^{his retirement} only doing thing at hand. For the priest: not choosing what one would like to do. i.e. being "all select."

Wednesday, Sept 29th

4:30 & 8:00 p.m. - Conference. - Continuation of subject of Discipleship: A disciple was ^{not} ~~not~~ learned from his master, v.g. Elijah & ~~Bishops~~, but who attended to his needs. The priest is to learn from Jesus: "I am the Way, and the Truth, and the Life", but the priest is also to minister to the needs of Jesus, the needs of His Body, the Church; of His members - the people of God, the priest's brothers & sisters in Christ. - Thus, discipleship after the Resurrection calls for deep Faith: "Lord, increase my Faith." Note, also, that the Apostles are now called "the Brethren."

Oct. 1st

Friday, 9:00 a.m. - Retreatmaster spoke of St. Teresa of the Child Jesus and her great interest in, & love for, priests. - Then, explained the project for a Franciscan House in the French Quarter, now being developed. - - -

I thanked God, once again, for graces given me at the International Eucharistic Congress in Philadelphia, particularly in area of breaking away from the use of "crazy" expressions (not obscene) when done, to let off steam. - I renew my resolve to hold to this.

- - - Retreatmaster asked us for prayers for himself & the French Quarter project. He also ~~urged~~ urged us to pray for all priests who made this retreat with ~~us~~ daily, until next retreat.

"He set his face resolutely towards Jerusalem."
